Victim Advocate After-Hours Crisis Line

Under DoD policy, military victim advocates, clinicians and health care providers can provide confidential support and information regarding domestic abuse, without reporting to law enforcement or the service member's command. Confidential reporting of domestic abuse is available to both active duty and family member spouses.

Victim advocates provide victims of abuse with information regarding safe and confidential ways to seek assistance, their rights, military and civilian orders for protection, and available civilian and military resources.
